SUMMARY

DUTIES

- 7. Guides the learning process toward the achievement of curriculum goals and, establishes clear objectives for all lessons, units, projects to communicate these objectives to students.
- 8. Assists in diagnosing the learning disabilities of students, with the assistance of district specialists.
- 9. Evaluates academic and social growth of students, keep appropriate records and prepare progress reports.
- 10. Maintains accurate, complete, and correct records as required by law, district policy, and administrative regulations.
- 11. Remains available to students and parents for education-related purposes outside the instructional day, such as parent teacher conferences.
- 12. Performs all other duties reasonably related to position as may be assigned by Building Administrator or Superintendent.
